
Great Sandy Desert 1 Sub-region

[†] The attributing of the state cadastral database has improved considerably over time. Therefore much of the land which had no tenure category assigned in 2002 will have been attributed and consequently distributed between other reporting categories in 2012. Much of this is expected to be distributed to the "Other public lands (roads and water bodies)" category, as road casings are progressively digitised and attributed, though increases in other categories is also possible as attributing improves.



- Emission Scenario: Medium CO₂ emissions, peaking around 2030 (SRES Marker Scenario A1B)
- Climate Sensitivity (Rate of Global Warming): Moderate rate of global warming corresponds to a global warming of 2.6°C for a doubling of CO2 from 280 ppm to 560 ppm.

High Impact Scenario:

- Emission Scenario: High CO2 emissions, increasing throughout the 21st century (SRES Marker Scenario A1FI)
- Climate Sensitivity (Rate of Global Warming): High rate of global warming corresponds to a global warming of 4.2°C for a doubling of CO2 from 280 ppm to 560 ppm.
